She also serves on the Board of Directors for the Colorado Treasury Management Association. Adding to her experience, she is nearing completion of a four-year term serving on the St. Olaf Alumni Board of Directors.

At 28 years old, Ms. Larson represents the youngest person ever appointed or elected to serve on the Board of Directors at Elevations Credit Union.

"She will also provide us added perspective on the behalf of younger members.
