Elevations Adds ATM with Capabilities for Visually Impaired Users



Boulder, CO — Elevations Credit Union has now made it easier and possible for visually impaired individuals to have full access to an ATM (Automated Teller Machine).

Near Elevations' on-campus branch at the University of Colorado at Boulder, in the University Memorial Center (UMC), an ATM has been equipped with a voice guidance system.

This system provides instructions to the user through a built-in audio port. This enables a visually impaired individual to conveniently, securely and easily carry out their financial transactions.

Customers simply plug a standard set of headphones into the ATM's headphone jack to hear instructions in either English or Spanish. Both audio and visual instructions are provided for

any ATM transactions being conducted, such as deposits, withdrawals, balance inquiries or transfers.

“We’re very pleased to be able to provide this opportunity for making our services more available and accessible to persons with disabilities,” said Craig Burkhard, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. “As a partner in this community, we believe it’s our responsibility to do all we can to make our services available to everyone.”
